Forest-cultivated shiitake mushroom production for diversified farms and startups

Join WSU Extension at the 78th Street Heritage Farm for one of our introductory workshop offerings this year covering the basics of producing shiitake mushrooms on logs, either as an enterprise to add to your farm's crop lineup, or as a small side business. The workshop will have a hands-on and interactive component; each registered farm will get to inoculate a log during the workshop to take home afterwards. Participants will also be provided with shiitake production guidance materials being developed by WSU Extension.
